## Board of Trustees Report

Currently, the Heads of Departments are busy completing their reports to the Board for our review. This is one of the many tools that the Board uses during the year to review student achievement. It also gives the Board a glimpse into what each course being offered at the school looks like for our students. We are looking forward to meeting with the Heads of Departments during May to discuss these documents and get feedback from our leaders about things that are working well in their departments and what their challenges are. It is also an opportunity to discuss the goals they have set for their department and how the Board can support them in achieving those goals.

Finances always seem to be a major part of each meeting in the ever increasing struggle to make the dollar go further to ensure that our students get all the opportunities that they deserve, without having to pass on escalating costs to parents/caregivers. We are always looking for ways to work smarter with our finances. Currently we are working with Arrow International to manage an upgrade of the technical area (excluding the hard materials area that has been recently completed). The Board are frustrated at the increasing cost of compliance for such a project, that consumes a large portion of the allocated funds and that we will be forced to make compromises between our dreams and vision for the area and our finances. Mr Nigel Scarth and Mr Jeff Ten-Thye were elected by the Board to be our representatives on the project control group that will steer the project.

Our Executive Officer, Mrs Judy Gould and Mr Ward have worked hard over the last financial year to turn a significant budgeted deficit around and to have achieved a cash positive return for the second year running. Thank you Judy and Gerry for all the time you take in this area to ensure we meet our obligations to be a fiscally responsible Board.

The Board are continuing to work with the Wyndham District Pool Committee who are committed to getting the school swimming pool repaired and running for the 2014/2015 season. This committee is full of enthusiasm to preserve this valuable district resource, again faced with growing running costs.

As usual there is always a lot happening at Menzies College to engage our students in learning and we have approved three more camps since the last meeting. We were delighted to receive an invitation to join the celebration of Literature Week today and we enjoyed seeing the students dressed up and participating in impromptu speeches and drama activities.

The next general meeting is on Thursday 29 May 2014, 7pm in the Transition Room.

This table below shows the details of four cars she finds at a local car dealer.

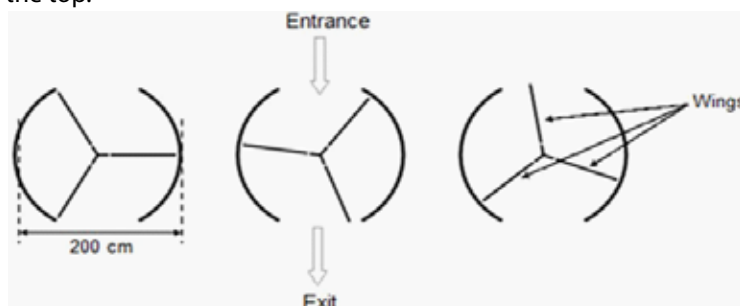

## Southland Rugby League 9 A Side Championship

The Menzies College Senior Boys Rugby League team competed in the Southland District Under 17 competition in Term 1 this year. Three other schools fielded teams - Aurora College, St Peters College and Southland Boys' High School. The competition was run over five weeks and all teams played each other at least twice. The Menzies team were magnificent in the way they played the games, their defence was superb, attack was classy and their team work and effort was amazing. They played the final two games on Wednesday 2 April at Elles Road. The first game was a semi against St Peters and the boys came back well from a slow start, to win by a score of 24 points to 12. They then played Southland Boys' High in the final and turned in a tremendous all round performance to beat them by 36 points to 14.



The Menzies team included hard working forwards Riley Ashby and Logan Macdonald who were always willing to make the hard yards and work like Trojans in defence. Jack Allison was almost unstoppable as a forward and used his deceptive pace and great strength to forge holes in the tightest of defences. Te Rua Fellows and captain, Nathan Bee, were real work horses of the team always being willing to carry the ball, make tackles or act as decoy runners. Tyrone Braven was like a perpetual motion machine, he never stopped in attack or defence and his energy and enthusiasm was infectious to his team mates. Rugby League newcomer, Joel Lamont acquitted himself really well and was a dependable worker in both attack and defence. Josh Barnfather played really well and impressed with his defensive abilities. Connor Millane lead the attack really well and was always on hand with his great support play or change of pace, to make a telling break. Caleb Young impressed with his 100% focus on the team and his attacking bursts and defensive hits acted as a spur to the team's confidence. 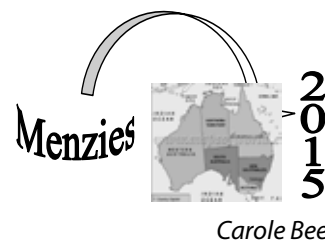
