From the Principal's Desk

Kia Ora

Last Friday, staff attended a combined Teacher Only Day at Northern Southland College. Approximately 250 Year 7 to 13 teachers and teacher aides were present at this fantastic opportunity, which enabled lots of ideas, student's work and course planning to be shared within subject areas or supporting curricula.

As I mentioned in an earlier newsletter, the opening speakers on the day were delivering information about Vocational Pathways. This is a framework used to provide young people with a greater range of options that will gain them NCEA Level 2, which is clearly regarded as the minimum academic requirement before leaving school. It's about schools designing courses and working in with other providers to more closely align the aspirations and aptitudes of students with their learning needs. It's about creating partnerships between secondary schools, tertiary providers, and employers and will in turn, see more young people leave school with a foundation level education, more students staying in education for longer and more transitioning to pathways that motivate them and contribute to the needs of our province.

In the afternoon Principals were addressed by Venture Southland who outlined our future employment needs and the figures are rather concerning. With the onset of most of our 'baby boomers' reaching retirement age by 2023, it is estimated that there will be 6,000 full time equivalent jobs arise in the South. The two main sectors that will need workers remain as dairying and its related industries and industries currently established in the South, with little change in the type of work we do as a province.

It is crucial that parents engage with their children around career advice and be actively involved in opportunities like the careersfest, option days at school and any tertiary applications. We are already seeing the effects of too many young adults training in the wrong area and you would only have to look at the number of physical education graduates without a job related to their qualification, to understand the importance of looking at the needs of our workforce rather than personal interest being the driver. Indicators are highlighting the need for quality graduates in all trades, engineering and computer related training.

My thanks to the swimming pool committee and the great work they have already undertaken through their fundraising efforts to re-establish the pool for community and school use. To re-open the pool will require more than just the energy of these people, so your support towards working bees or fundraising ventures would be greatly appreciated.

Thanks also for the renewed support of our school canteen. After running at a loss for many years, the canteen is now trading near to breaking even, due in large to the efforts of our staff Rachel and Anne and the good number of students now buying a hot meal each day at either interval or lunch. They were extremely pleased to receive several letters of appreciation from students and have adopted some of the positive ideas expressed. There are two of these letters later in this newsletter.

Board of Trustees Report

The Board of Trustees have just completed the 2013 round of Head of Department report meetings. After receiving each department's written report on their progress against the department and school wide goals and student achievement, we meet with each department head to discuss these reports and gain further insight. The Board were very pleased with these reports this year and with the progress that has been made in all departments since last year's reports. All departments are working particularly hard on the school wide goal of lifting the number of endorsements gained by our NCEA candidates in external exams and this has been reflected in their results. Most departments have set this as a continuing focus for 2014. On behalf of The Board of Trustees I wish to congratulate the heads and their staff on their continued hard work on behalf of our students.

It was pleasing that this year we changed the format of the meetings a little and met the heads in their learning areas around the school. This afforded us a great opportunity to view the learning environment and some of the students' work. It was most enjoyable and a format that I think will be continued in the future.

The Board held a general meeting last Thursday at which we discussed several strategic decisions which included the swimming pool, the purchased mini van, the draft policies that were constructed at our recent policy day and the redrawn plans for the development of the technical block. The Board and the senior leadership team, continue to be frustrated by the lack of change that can be brought about by the funds we have available, once we have met all the compliance cost, such as up-grading wiring and lighting. We will continue to look for options to maximise what we are able to achieve for the students in this area and to fight for what we believe our students deserve.

Education Outside the Classroom continues to thrive at Menzies College and the Board approved a number of camps and outings at this meeting including Tautuku Pre-Camp, Tautuku Year 9 camp, Science Enrichment camp to Dunedin, the Year 13 Chemistry camp to Dunedin and the Assisted Duke of Edinburgh residential camp to Dunedin.

As usual we also dealt with the financial and staffing matters that arise from time to time and received the Principal's report in which Mr Ward outlines what has been happening at the school, how we are meeting our obligations to the Ministry of Education and how we are measuring up against the school wide goals that have been set for this year. We also accepted the annual budget that has been prepared and we are tracking very well against this at about one third of the way through the financial year.





Shaunni's positive attitude will serve her well as she continues her education and eventually moves on into her chosen career path.

Nathan will cover:


- an overview of research that relates directly to teaching and parenting with more depth for the practitioner

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
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
