## **From the Principal's Desk**

### **Kia Ora**

One of the demands upon schools today, is the need to be carefully monitoring the progress of our students in order to achieve the best possible result for them. We use language terms such as 'tracking' or 'priority learners' to describe the process or cohort of learners. We are looking at working much closer with our contributing schools in discussing what a National Standard looks like for each student and to moderate for consistency. We are also a part of the Lower Matura Valley cluster of schools that meet once a term to look at the issues facing our community of learners. This cluster also has the potential to expand to become a 'Community of Schools' as part of the Governments, Invest in Education Success (IES) programme.

Students are also looking at themselves. Staff have been assisting students with 'Learning Logs' that enable a student to reflect on their learning needs and to discuss these in partnership. These are the key understandings that need to be a focus if progressions are to be forthcoming.

What I have seen change at Menziess College, is the ability for students to talk about their learning in a better, more relevant context. When asked, most can tell you what their strengths and weaknesses are and this is an important conversation that can also take place in the home.

On Tuesday we will be hosting our second Parent/Teacher interview evening of the year. Normally the turn out at this night is much lower than the first one, but it is certainly no less significant and I would hope we could have a lift in attendance this year, (book online through our website). With NCEA practice exams now completed and the real thing just around the corner, it is crucial that this triangulated meeting occurs. Students need to get a clear directive of what's required to get across the line or an endorsed grade. Parents also need to hear this and know how they can help. Plans need to be made with staff so students can get their best result. For some senior students it may involve dropping a standard or two to focus on what is achievable. I've looked at our 'tracking' of internal standards for the year to date and a group of students currently sit in the crevasse that lies between success or failure. A few are deeper than others, but most can be 'pulled up' if they allow help and look for help. This means 100% attendance from now on in class and in the many tutorials offered. Short-term pain for long-term gain.

Students should also be in the habit of monitoring their own progress by looking up their NZQA profile for which they have their personal details and passwords. It is important that students know that everything matters and a few credits gained now could play a huge part in determining whether they make the magic figure come January.

As I was returning from town today I listened to the most brilliant talk on National Radio by Nathan Mikaere Wallis who is part of the Brain Wave Trust and X Factor Education. He is speaking about Gifted and Talented children and how the home and school can manage this. (Thursday 18 September about 11.20am). Tune in as it's right on the money as far as practicality goes in this issue.

Work Day has returned over \$6,000 so far with still many more students to bring in their money. This will go a long way towards asset purchases for the students and our thanks to all those who have contributed so positively.

# Science Department

## Biological and Physical Sciences - Year 11 Science Update

I am pleased to inform you of the two new Biological and Physical sciences courses we will be offering at Year 11 next year. These will be in place of the current 101 and 102 science courses. The reasons for the changes are as follows:

- To give students a greater range of choice in Year 11 and a greater chance of success. Students can now choose whether to study one science course, two science courses or no science course at Year 11 and have a timetable that best suits their own interests.
- The Biological and Physical science courses will better prepare the students for the separate Biology, Chemistry and Physics courses in Year 12.
- All students will be able to choose a science course that leads onto a science course at Year 12 which 102 science currently does not.

The Biological Sciences course is a combination of Biology and Chemistry while the Physical sciences contain Physics and Chemistry. If a student were to choose both of these courses the Chemistry content would be different and so the content would not overlap.

## Science Enrichment Camp

Twenty-six Year 7 and 8 students attended the Science Enrichment camp at Dunedin last week and had a fabulous time. Our first stop was viewing the Yellow Eyed penguins on the Otago Peninsula on a beautiful blue skied afternoon. We were lucky enough to see five different penguins, one coming out of the water and the others moving to prepare their nesting sites for their chicks. The next morning we were at the Otago University foods department for the sensory food tasting challenge. We explored the different flavours and tastes we experience from our food. A visit to the chocolate factory was the highlight for many students before we set sail to the Otago museum for an evening science session and a night sleeping on the floor of Discovery World. 'Lotions and Potions' was a hands-on chemistry activity and a visit to tropical world with the butterflies was the final event.

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
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
