## Incubator

### Classroom Session - Wednesday 17 September

#### Guest Speaker

Wendy McStay is a registered nurse who works in the Surgical Ward at Southland Hospital five days a fortnight. Before this permanent job Wendy was working on the casual list which meant she had flexibility to say yes or no if she was rung up and offered work for nurses who were sick or on leave.

Wendy went to high school in Alexandra, Central Otago and completed her nursing education at Southern Institute of Technology nearly 25 years ago. This education course has provided a vast range of nursing jobs and opportunities that Wendy appreciates. A typical day for Wendy is starting at 7am where she listens to a ward report on every patient and hears how they are progressing. After reporting, the team leader allocates four or five patients to Wendy's care, she then reads their notes and makes a plan of care for them for the day. Good time management is an essential component of being a nurse. After she has organised herself she checks on all the patients and starts by taking their observations before administering medications. Her work centres around ensuring her patients' needs are met. This involves dietary, hygiene, mobility needs and wound care. Wendy then shared with the group an example of patients she had cared for recently who required a special type of dressing called a Vac, whereby suction assists the wound to heal.

#### Card Sort

The group then undertook an instrument card sort game whereby students are divided into groups and have to match metal surgical instruments with their name and use. Pictured below are the winners Gabby McCall and Miss Katie Hall with their prize of a USB and other groups at work on the card sort game. This was the final session for Incubator this year.

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
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
