Mathematics Department

In the last week of Term 3, Menzies College competed in the annual SMAC Maths competition at James Hargest College. Overall, the competition had more entries than previous years and we had more Menzies teams entered than normal (one Year 7, two Year 8, one Year 9 and two Year 10). Our students performed admirably, showing that a small rural school can foot it with much larger schools. Our Year 7 and 10 teams did particularly well. One of the Year 10 teams finished 4th which is the best result for a Menzies team for some time.

We also recently received the certificates from the Junior Mathematics Competition organised by the University of Otago. This was open to Year 9-11 students and again we had higher numbers than previous years. All students did well, with many posting competitive scores. The organisers provide participation certificates for all entrants and also a special 'Best in School' certificate for the student who performed the best. This year, it went to Joseph Ferguson. Huge congratulations to him – these competitions provide extra practice at problem solving which should translate into these students being stronger candidates in NCEA. Life Education Trust Bus

Next Tuesday to Thursday the Year 7-8 students will be receiving a visit from the Life Education Trust Bus as part of their Drug Education. We have already had the DARE Programme led by Linda Graham Youth Education Police Officer from Gore. There is a small cost involved with this visit and each Year 7-8 student has been charged \$2 to their school account to help with overall costs. Life Education is a charity that provides children with the knowledge to make informed choices about their health, respect others and learn to appreciate their uniqueness.

This module focuses on drug use and the impact of various drugs on individuals, friends and families. A hard hitting video titled 'The Web of Addiction' is used, telling real life stories from New Zealanders about their experiences in the drug world. A co-operative, classification activity about illegal drugs is followed by a lesson about alcohol. Throughout this module links are made to the development of young adults physically, mentally and emotionally. Puberty is explored as well as the development of the human brain and the effects of drugs.

Wyndham District Community Pool



Telford Taster Week

In the second week of the holidays I went to a 'Telford Taster Week' to find out what it is actually like at Telford. The camp went from the afternoon of Tuesday (7th) until Saturday morning (11th).

We were split in to groups of 7 or 8 and the Equine and Rural Animal Technician students went off and did specialised learning. Each day we had breakfast before 8am, morning tea from 10:00-10:30am, lunch from 12:00-1:00pm, afternoon tea from 2:30-3:00pm and then tea and dessert at 5:30pm.

On Wednesday we had four 90 minute activities throughout the day. We wrote a CV, learnt and used four methods of measuring the dry matter of grass, pulled apart a chainsaw and learnt about chainsaw safety. We then learnt about ATV safety, did a pre-ride check and drove around on a couple of courses on the quad bikes. After tea we went to Balclutha where we could go swimming or go to the sports complex. Then we had free time back at Telford until lights out at 10:30pm.

On Thursday we had three 90 minute activities where we learnt to cut up a sheep with the butchery tutor, played an agricultural monopoly game and had a session in the classroom focussing on the Telford dairy farm statistics. After lunch we had farm visits at the Deer and Dairy units. That night we went down to Nugget Point and walked up to the lighthouse. We then had free time until lights out.

On Friday we had a 90 minute talk in the morning from 2 tutors about agricultural careers and how we can achieve our 5 year plan. We then went to Balclutha to visit a salmon farm and a wool broker. In the afternoon we had a competition in our groups, competing in five different activities including a gumboot throw and farm equipment identification. Later that day we went and talked to the dog training tutors. The tutors and diploma students then demonstrated their dogs at various stages of training, working the sheep. That night we had a debrief about the week with Suzanne, the Student Liaison Officer and organiser of Taster Week, won spot prizes and asked questions about applying for Telford and the courses. We also received a list of the Scholarships and Bursaries Telford students can apply for.

Overall, I had an amazing week. I met some awesome people from all over New Zealand, had amazing food at every meal and found out a lot about the Polytechnic. I got to meet a few tutors who were really helpful and easy to get along with. This taster camp really helped me finalise my decision to study at Telford Rural Polytechnic in 2015. I highly recommend anyone in Years 12 and 13 who are interested in agriculture to go on a taster camp. I guarantee you'll have a great time!

Lastly, I would like to thank Mr Clark for organising this for me at the last minute.

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
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
