# From the Principal's Desk

#### Kia Ora

Now that the term is well underway a number of reports on data can be finalised. This week we forwarded to the Ministry our 1st March return. Student numbers of 303 are the highest we have been at this time of year for several years and we had a final 2015 intake of 61 new students, 40 of whom are in Year 7 and the other 21 spread across the school. Of this, 71 of our students identify as Maori, we have 176 males and 127 females. There are 60 students in Year 9 and now that the return is complete, I have been able to place an advert for an additional part-time teacher to assist these classes in core subjects.

On Thursday night 19 March from 3.45 to 6.15pm we will be holding parent/teacher interviews. Because of building alterations, these will be held in rooms 1 to 6 and the technology block. These interviews are to gain an early indication of how your child has started the year and to raise any issues that may support their learning. Already 39 families have booked online with 190 interview slots reserved.

I have written previously about the 2014 NCEA results and the difference between roll and participation based data. I take the latter as being the true indicator as these are the students who actually stay the year and sit the exam. The table below is a summary of our past five years of NCEA exams and shows the steady improvement made by our students and effort from staff and parent/caregivers to ensure students do well. Personally, I'm over the moon with the improvement and our community should be also.


