## From the Principal's Desk

### Kia Ora

Next week we will be visited by the Education Review Office (ERO) as part of their regular cycle. The purpose of ERO is to give an external perspective on a school's teaching and learning, governance and management. The review will take account of what is special about our school, how well the school's curriculum helps all students to be engaged in learning and how well they achieve. In the end, the review will provide the school and community with an independent view of our current performance with comment on where we could improve further.

In planning its charter, the Menzies College Board of Trustees has identified six strategic priorities for the next three years. In brief these are:

- Continue to grow the development of our professional learning community
    - a focus on Teaching as Inquiry and our staff appraisal system remain a priority
  - Focus on tracking the academic achievement of all identified priority learners from Years 7 to 12
  - Embed into teaching situations, the values of the curriculum, the selected principles of 'learning to learn and future focus', so students' personal learning goals drive improved outcomes
  - Increase the adoption of technologies into planning and teaching delivery to enhance student outcomes through inquiry and curiosity.
  - Focus placed on student and staff wellbeing so all can feel healthy, comfortable and appreciated in their teaching and learning environments
  - To best use available resources to reflect the school priorities, maintain and protect assets and provide financial stability.
- Once the charter has been approved and agreed with by the Ministry a full copy will be available on our website.

On Thursday we celebrated the appointment of our lead Maori students. We are delighted to announce Te Rua Fellows as our Nga Whatukura and Kirsty Panirau as Mariekura for 2015. With 71 Maori students on our roll both Te Rua and Kirsty have an important role in supporting the wellbeing of these students. We wish them both well in this position.

Many thanks to the parents/caregivers and students who attended last evening's meeting with teachers. The purpose of the night was to get an early indication of how well your child has settled in to school and where they need to apply themselves as we work to raise their achievement. If you wish to have further discussion on matters that arose last night, please feel welcome to ring the school and make an appointment. Staff were encouraged by the turnout, 90 families made online bookings.

Of the 25 Students that competed on Friday, 11 qualified for the Otago/Southland championships this weekend at Surrey Park, Invercargill as well as two relay teams.

On the track, Tyla Adams qualified fifth in the 100m and placed third in the 200m. Jordan Medley also qualified for 100m, placing sixth and 200m placing fifth. While in the seniors, Joseph Ferguson came fourth in the 400m and fifth in the 800m finals. Hayden Stuart had an excellent finish in his 800m final finishing in second place. The field events were equally as strong with Gabby Knapp qualifying sixth in the discus and Kailey Yeomen placing fourth in the under 14 girls javelin. Naam Whan Panto has also qualified in her age group in third place in the javelin. Hannah Wallis had a productive and exciting birthday qualifying for both shot put and discus with a fifth and third placing. Rebekah Kingdon came through in fourth place for shot put and just missed out in discus coming seventh. Jordan Stuart qualified in the triple jump. We had boys teams entered in the under 15 relay and senior relay. Both teams ran an impressive race, the Under 15's consisted of Max McDonald, Jordan Medley, Ricci Paderanga and William Dickey. They came in fifth place and the Seniors; Courtneah Mitchell, Joseph Ferguson, Jared Hutton and Jordan Stuart came in fourth place, guaranteeing both teams a spot at the Otago/Southland Athletic Championships. Menzies College was placed fifth overall in the points tally out of the 14 schools that competed on Friday. Well done Menzies an outstanding effort all round.

When - Wednesday 15 April from 9am-3pm

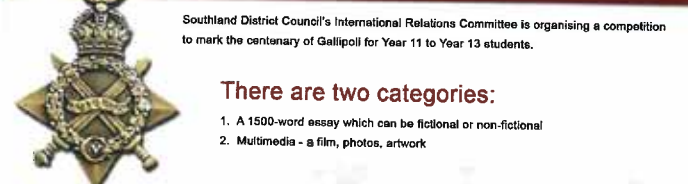
Plus Wednesday 8 July (to complete course and sign off on the NCEA credits)

The main objective of this course is to increase the pool of referees available to referee rugby in Southland. Participants must be capable of refereeing 'A' Grade (Under 13) rugby and above. Suitable participants may referee at Under 14 and above levels depending on their ability. The course for 2015 will be held over 2 days – one in each school holidays. During term 2, participants will be required to actively referee a minimum of six games in order to attend the second day of the course and sign off on the NCEA credits. Lunch will be provided for all candidates, along with a Referee Polo. At the completion of this course, successful applicants will receive NCEA credits.

### Course background

The Course is designed specifically for teenagers and involves a combination of both theory and practical based training sessions.
