<u>COLD AND FLU SEASON</u> - how to be prepared.

There are many different options for treating cold and flu symptoms. Cold and flu tablets are a great first stop for many people. The paracetamol helps with aches, pains, chills and fevers whilst the decongestant helps unblock the nose and



sinuses. The night-time tablet also contains a sedating antihistamine which offers further decongestant action while helping you get a good night's sleep. Some of the formulation contains products to help with a cough so ask pharmacy staff which is the best for you. Most people choose an all-in-one day night tablet, however there are a number of really good natural remedies available – talk to a pharmacist or visit a natural health shop/professional.

Note: You cannot take cold and flu tablets if you have any heart problems or high blood pressure.

Buccaline – Tried and true! Helps prevent the bacterial complications of a cold. This is not a substitute though for the flu vaccine.




Otrivin nasal spray – is the safest decongestant for people with high blood pressure or heart problems and women who are pregnant.

Cough mixtures – coughs fall into two different categories: Dry or Chesty. A *dry cough* is tickly and irritating and usually non-stop for which a cough suppressant is the best. A *chesty cough* rattles down in your chest and is productive (coughing up mucous) and for this a expectorant and mucolitic (this breaks down the mucous and helps you clear it off your chest).



Vitamin C – a strong anti-bacterial and anti-viral, is an excellent preventative and cure for the common cold. It is good to take daily over the winter season and if you do get a cold you can increase the dose temporarily to help your body recover quicker.



Olive leaf – boosts the body's natural immune response to winter ills and chills. Olive leaf has strong anti-microbial properties to help slow the growth of bacteria and prevent the replication of viruses. Therefore, it helps the body fight infections and improves the body's natural immunity to infections.

Echinacea – is a natural antibiotic and infection fighter.

Garlic and Zinc - also worth considering. Garlic is effective in combating bacteria, viruses and fungi and Zinc possesses anti-viral properties.

Flu immunisation – available from your family doctor and is free for over 65 yr olds, pregnant woman and those with long term health conditions – check with your doctor or midwife.
