# From the Principal's Desk

On Monday the draft copy of our recent Education Review Office visit was provided to the Board and Staff to seek comment before a final confirmed copy is presented. This is an exceptionally good report and all members of our school and school community should feel very proud of their input towards achieving this. It recognises the very good work that has occurred over the last few years and rightly points us towards the next steps in these developments. I could include a lot of comments from the report but a confirmed report will eventually be available on our website. I will just quote their brief conclusion:

"Students interact positively across the age ranges. They engage well in their learning. They appreciate the way staff work to make learning interesting and challenging. Teachers are planning how to lift levels of achievement where accelerated improvement is needed. Senior students achieve well and actively plan for success beyond school".

On Monday we will take nine Year 7 and 8 students through to The National Young Leaders Days at the Dunedin Town Hall. This presentation is for Year 7 and 8 students only and is a great opportunity to hear some of our modern day leaders and personalities talk about being a leader. The intention of the presentation is to inspire and motivate our young people with positive life stories and personal values.

If you want a most inspiring presentation attend THE TEENAGE BRAIN with Nathan Mikaere-Wallis evening in Gore on 10 June. Details are in this newsletter but you will need to book. If you are unsure if this is for you and your teenage child, google it and listen to his content. Our staff will attend one of his workshops on our Teacher Only Day on 29 May, along with the other rural secondary schools. I understand some of our contributing schools are also having professional development days on the Friday of Queen's Birthday weekend.

About the time you read this newsletter our Head of Maths, Mr Brendon Wallace will have just completed the 250km bike ride from Queenstown to Invercargill to assist in raising funds for the local Chopper Appeal. Brendon collected more than \$800 through the school and another \$300 from friends and family for this very valuable service. We have had to use this service in the past with school camps and it is essential that it can be maintained as an affordable service.

#### **Board of Trustees Report**

A general meeting of the Menzies College Board of Trustees was held on Thursday 28 March and as usual it was a full agenda. Among the strategic discussions we held, the proposed introduction of a senior uniform was discussed. The Board are very thankful to Mrs Lucy McKelvie and Mr Carl Lambert for the time they have taken to consult with the student body and also to Mrs McKelvie for her time in putting a proposal and possible costs together for public consultation. Due to what the Board felt was a very low response to the previous community consultation (we would like to have confidence that any decision we make has the backing of the majority of families in the school), it was decided that we will mail the consultation document again to all families and we strongly urge you to have your say so we can make an informed decision. These papers will be numbered to insure only one return per family.

Mr Ward reported that the Lower Mataura Valley Community of Schools application (part of the Investing in Educational Success government initiative) has been accepted and we are joined by Wyndham, Edendale, Glenham and Tuturau Primary Schools to work collaboratively to improve the communication and the sharing of professional skills between schools. The aim is to improve our students' experience as they move between these schools and also to ensure transitions are smooth and that we are making the most of the skills and practises that our schools already have in place. This group has held its first meeting and is already identifying ways in which we can benefit each other and our students.

At our last meeting the Board voted to spend a sum of money on upgrading Computer room 2 and also the computers in it. This work was carried out during the school holidays and the result is a much more pleasant and functional learning space and two rooms of functioning computers. Thank you to Mr Eamon Dakin and Mr Matt Cook for their extra effort over the holidays to make this happen for our students. We also noted that we have been able to move back into the Foods room with some minor finishing work to happen in there.

Mr Ward also reported that a large group of senior students attended an open day at Otago University and Polytechnic and it is pleasing that such a large number are considering tertiary education as an option to begin their path to become 'Life Long Learners'.

Tyrone Braven, the student representative, reported briefly on the successful Menzies College Sports Tour to Australia that took place recently. The sporting experiences were positive and worthwhile and the theme parks and shopping were pretty good too.

There were also a large number of school camp proposals approved for this term indicating term 2 is also going to be a busy one. The Board are always very thankful to the staff who take responsibility for organising and running these camps as it is a tremendous responsibility we place on their shoulders with some of these camps taking place in very unique and challenging environments.

The next general meeting is scheduled for Thursday 28 May 2015 at 7pm in the transition room.


