From the Principal's Desk

Kia Ora

Many thanks to the parents/caregivers who attended last night's parent/teacher evening. These conversations are important as we all work together on the learning of our students and shape a pathway for future academic success during the remainder of the school year. It is important that these plans are now adhered to and we share in monitoring the progress of students. Today we had our Kapa Haka-Waiata House Competition and although at the time of printing we do not know the results, observations from practices would indicate that it will be very tight for the judges to select a winner. This competition has seen a number of our students step up as leaders and in the end this is a most important aspect in the purpose of these House competitions. The more "student led" we can have these competitions the better the engagement we see from the other students. We also see the huge benefits of the work undertaken by Bex Brown with our Kapa Haka group coming through at this time.

Over the month of July we had our Year 7 & 8 students away at Deep Cove, our Year 9's at Tautuku and our special needs students up in Queenstown. Despite the weather we had here, most groups had great conditions to undertake set activities in and all parties have come back enthused by the attitude of the students and the challenges they completed. Many thanks to the staff, parents and senior students who made these camps so enjoyable.

This seems to have been a long term and certainly there have been signs of students feeling the pinch as more illness and tiredness sets in. It is crucial that students take time to refresh but also manage the assignments and study that must be completed during the break.

Menzies College and our four key contributing schools have been successful in establishing ourselves as a "Community of Schools" which is part of the Government's Invest in Education Programme. We are the only cluster of this nature south of Christchurch and are reasonably well set up due to the existing partnerships that were in place. We will be holding a consultation evening for about an hour on July 29th in the school hall starting at 7.00pm. Everyone is welcome as we inform you of how a Community of Schools can operate and welcome your inputting of ideas to this. All the jobs have been allocated, there is no committee....it's just your vision and ideas we want to be consulted about. Information regarding this is further on in the newsletter.

Board of Trustees Report

The Board held a general meeting last Thursday night. It has been a busy first half of the year with the Education Review Office (ERO) visit and most of the school camps occurring in the first half of the year.

The main topics of discussion at Thursday's meeting were:

- The sale of a school house has released some funds we are able to add to our 5YA (funds that we can spend on building projects such as the recent remodel of the technical block in the next 5 years).
- Mr Ward presented some data he is beginning to collate around the progress of our year 7 & 8 students as measured by the National Standards. These will be finalised and presented in their final form at the August meeting.
- A review of the Head of Department reporting process that has been recently completed. The heads report on student achievement and department goals progress for the prior year to the Board and this year we chose to hear these in a group fomat. Everyone seemed to enjoy the change and further alterations to what we require to be reported and how, was signalled at these meetings following the ERO review.
- The C Block upgrade is very nearly completed and the overall result is very pleasing with students enjoying the fresher more modern environment in the foods room.
- The Lower Mataura Valley Community of Schools (formed under the governments Investing in Educational Success programme) is functioning very well and is being held up to other regions as a model that is to be aspired to.
- The school's finances continue to track well with expenditure within the budget levels expected at this time of the year.
- Approval was given for a number of EOTC events including a number of sports teams travelling to tournament. We wish these groups well. It is perhaps timely to mention that the school now requires (as part of the Vulnerable Children's Act compliance) all adults that may be in a position to have unsupervised (by a staff member who is a registered teacher) access to students in any capacity in the school, or as part of school activities outside of the classroom or school day, to be Police vetted. This is a simple procedure but it does require some forward planning as the process is currently taking about 8 weeks to complete due to the large number of organisations now required to comply with this.

We wish the Menzies staff and our school families a safe and restful holiday and hope that students come back refreshed for what is the "business" end of the year, especially for the senior students.
