A huge congratulations to Brock Stuart who won the Venture Southland Year 7 and 8 Speech Competition at Aurora College on Wednesday night. Brock's speech titled 'My Love of Food' highlighted Brock's passion for food which is also his hobby. He spoke about the importance of healthy eating and maintaining a balanced plate so that we can give our bodies the fuel we need. Brock made clever use of expression, humour and research to create and present his winning speech. Brock is the first student from an Eastern Southland school to win this competition and is the final step of a string of successes for Brock after he won the Menzies College Speech Competition, the Eastern Area Final and Central Speech Finals held at St Peter's College and Makarewa.

As previously mentioned, all senior students will wear uniform next year. Information will be sent home early next term showing the changes and costings. Last week we had a picture in the newsletter of our Year 9 girl's band 'The Menzies Angels' - group of lovely young ladies well engaged in school and high achievers in everything they undertake. I was sent an email from a good supporter of the school telling me there had been 68 'Likes' on our Facebook page and how awesome this was. I totally agree! On the same day a carpark fight between school girls in South Auckland had 700,000 viewings on Facebook and 15,000 'Likes'. It worries me what is happening with our social network tools like Facebook. Our Deans and Deputy Principals too frequently deal with issues that should never have appeared as photos, video or text, let alone interfere with the wellbeing and learning of others. Quite clearly, content like the girl fight, emotional comments and general filth interest a number of our students. I ask that families again check on how they are using the tools we have been given to communicate and discuss the dangers and consequences of making poor choices around what content is passed on.

It would be appreciated if the families in our community that intend to enrol their child here for 2016 please make an effort to complete this process during the week. Over the break we want to organise staffing and timetable options for next year but rely on knowing our numbers more accurately in order to complete this process.

I wish all the students and staff involved with our production 'Henry' the very best for Wednesday and Thursday evening. I appreciate the effort that students put into making this happen and hope they gain all the benefits that performing on stage allows. Many thanks to Mrs Cowley and staff for their energy and encouragement towards making this exciting production happen.

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## School Buses

Currently there is a roll taken every afternoon as students get on their bus to go home. We have found this system to be inaccurate as bus students often do not travel home on their bus (eg. sports practices, tutorials, parents picking up). From next week we will no longer take a bus roll. Instead all school buses will remain at Menzies College until 3.25pm. This gives students 10 minutes after the bell to get to their bus and based on current trends, this gives students ample time to do this. Mrs Cowley (bus co-ordinator) or another staff member will be responsible for 'waving' the buses off no earlier than 3.25pm each day. Bus drivers will still have a roll to refer to so that they have a record of students who are entitled to travel on their bus run.

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## School Uniform

We have noticed that there are a few 'non uniform' items being worn to school such as hoodies and puffer jackets. Can you please check that your child is wearing the correct uniform. If there is a reason why correct uniform cannot be worn, please write a note explaining the situation so that their Dean or Senior Management can provide a uniform pass. NZQA can be contacted on 0800 697296 to reset a username or password. Mr Peter Wilkinson updates school credits every fortnight. Keep an eye on your credits so that you know what you need to achieve Level 1/2/3 or to gain a Merit or Excellence subject or level Endorsement.

To apply online you will need:

1. RealMe login or RealMe Verified Identity. To access this service you need a RealMe login. This will give you access to a range of services with a single username and password, and much more. You only need one RealMe login and it's designed to protect your privacy and security.
2. Your IRD number.
3. Your bank account details.
4. Your email address.
5. The name of education provider(s) you will be studying at.
6. Approximate course start and end dates.

He also gave a very nice 'thank you' speech at the end. We were really impressed by the encouragement each student gave to their peers and by the fact that everyone participated in a safe and light-hearted manner.



**Following that we moved to Splash Palace** for a quick dip and time on the hydro-slide. It was great fun and the students (again) conducted themselves in a polite and friendly manner to all those they spoke to.

**After a quick lunch at McDonalds,** our final activity was at the Southland Museum where we had an interactive lesson on World War One and looked at the new exhibition. This was really good revision for us on our theme for the year (war) and learning about life in the trenches was interesting. Saxton McGregor delivered a lovely 'thank you' speech, and then it was time to return to Menzies College.
