Outward Bound, Anakiwa



Twenty one days. You know nobody. No cell phone. No internet. No television. No newspaper. NO outside world connections, accept snail mail. Placed in a group with 12 other strangers from throughout New Zealand. I can not underestimate how mentally and physically challenging this was.

Daily routines included a 5.55am wake up call, followed by a morning warm up, 3.2km run, a jump in the ocean and a cold shower. I spent three days sailing amongst dolphins, seals and other spectacular wildlife. Two days 'practice' tramping before our big expedition, two days volunteering on the Link Water Pathway that is currently being made, two days kayaking on the most amazing rivers, three days alone in the bush solo, completing high rope courses, rock climbing and completing a half marathon. Our last expedition was a three day tramp lead and run by my group. We had to climb three mountains within the

allocated time or else we had to spend another night in the bush until we were finished. On the second day of this trip we reached the summit of Mount Baldy (our third mountain) at around 5pm. This literally had to be the highlight of my trip - 1,315m up, 27degrees and the clearest of skies. We had made it! Our instructor suggested that we could sleep on top of the mountain for the night with just our sleeping bags - wicked! I watched the sun go down as I lay in bed and counted one by one as the stars appeared. I woke again in time for the sun rise and I can't even put into words how truly magnificent it was! The places I have seen, the things I have achieved, the people I have met and the experiences I have endured will stick with me forever.

A special thanks to The Community Trust of Southland and Mr Ward for granting me the scholarship. If you EVER get the opportunity to attend Outward Bound I strongly urge you to grab it with both hands, it will give you a new perspective on life.


