Reporting in 2017

In 2017 our reporting system will be different in many ways. These changes are based on research findings and are a continuation of the review and trial conducted in the second half of 2016. Changes are motivated by a desire to further improve student learning and home/school communication. One of the changes is the removal of LLP that only applied to Years 9 and 10 and the introduction of Learning Updates twice a term for all students.

These are based on:

- Attendance
- Managing Self
- Relating to Others

These Key Competencies (KC) have been chosen because they are essential foundations for all learning. How students are expected to Manage Self and Relate to Others will differ in each class and at each year level. Subject teachers and classes will work together to determine what it will look like in their class. Teachers will assess the level students (students may also self-assess) are on for each KC and use Learning Logs to reflect on ways they can progress to the next level. In week 4 the school will make the first electronic report on these available to students and parents. Deans will also review this information to determine any students who require extra support.

Learning logs will be important tools to communicate between students and the subject teacher. In the next week or two students will notice all subject teachers talking to them about setting goals, reflection, learning logs and what the KC's look like in their subject. Subject teachers will be in touch with home regularly via email and phone calls but there will no longer be planned parent teacher interviews with subject teachers. The Whanau teacher takes over this roll with Whanau Conferences. They will also talk to students in their whanau class regularly about learning goals and help them to maintain a Learning Folder that contains notes and information for conferences.

The first Whanau Conference is in week 6. Interviews will be 20 minutes long. One of the whanau teachers will meet with students and caregivers to discuss the students Learning Logs, Learning Update report and your goals for the year. The other change is written reports will only be produced at the end of the year by the Whanau teacher (with the exception of National Standards reports which will still be mid and end of year). Information on grades and progress will be made available regularly.

Defence Careers Experience (DCE)

This year Southern Recruiting will be offering a Defence Careers Experience specifically for young women interested in a career in the New Zealand Defence Force. Details for this event are yet to be confirmed, however it is likely to occur mid-year and be conducted at Woodbourne Air Force Base in Blenheim. The DCE will be a great opportunity to gain an insight into life within the services, gain valuable teamwork and leadership skills, learn about career opportunities, and interact with other women currently serving in the Defence Force.

We are also intending to conduct a second DCE later in the year which will be offered to Year 11-13 students. This will most likely occur in September and be conducted at Burnham Military Camp in Christchurch. Further details and information regarding the application process for both DCE's will be released once we have confirmed these events. STAR Courses

In conjunction with the Government, secondary schools, polytechnics and other training providers are helping young people identify their vocational pathway by offering STAR courses which allow students to study programmes not available through their secondary school. This offers an opportunity for students to have a clear pathway into tertiary programmes or to achieve vocational credits alongside their school qualifications.

What is STAR?

A Secondary Tertiary Alignment Resource (STAR) course introduces secondary school students to training for a specific career or study at tertiary level. STAR courses are short and are only available through polytechnics and private training organisations. Students participate in short-term programmes or 'taster courses' for a few days at a time, or one day per week for several weeks.

Music Level 2 starting 10th March and 16th June

HPV Immunisation

From this year all boys and girls in Year 8 are able to have the HPV vaccine at school to protect them against future infection from nine types of HPV that lead to cervical, anal, genital, mouth and throat cancers, as well as genital warts. HPV is the final immunisation given as part of New Zealand's free childhood immunisation programme.

All year 8 students have been given a consent form which includes detailed information about the immunisation. Please complete the consent form, either consenting or declining to the school based programme and return the form to school no later than Wednesday 22 February. Even if you do not wish your child to have this vaccination, the form needs to be completed in the **appropriate space and returned to school.** For more information visit:
