School is well and truly underway and this term has moved very quickly as we end week five. On the whole I am pleased with the way students have settled in to school this year and the positive atmosphere which is evident.

One of our key challenges this year is to change the way we report to all parents/caregivers about their child's learning. This is a shared process we refer to as 'Conferencing' and the first meeting is next Wednesday 8 March from 2.00pm until 7.40pm. There is an expectation that every student and a parent/caregiver is present for this important meeting as the whanau teacher and student discuss their schooling and set learning goals around where they need to focus. All students received a hand out yesterday about the process and how to make online bookings. There is further information inside this newsletter that may assist with the booking process. Staff are looking forward to these meetings and we hope they can be more productive in sharing our understandings and gathering student and parent voice for improved learning results.

Yesterday's assembly focused on students 'Managing Self', one of the five key competencies in the NZ Curriculum. Hopefully, students now understand that this is more than just keeping to their timetable or wearing uniform well and instead, address the deeper issues like managing their health and emotions, busy schedules, failure and relationships to name just a few components. We want to keep this competency along with 'Relating to Others' on top this year and we can be supported at home if parents/ caregivers also refer to this and check how their child is coping with meaningful discussions from time to time. Studies have shown that those who manage themselves well also have greater success in most things they take on.

Urgent Attention: Whanau Conferences

The first Whanau conference about student learning happens next week on Wednesday 8 March from 2pm-4.40pm and 6pm -7.40pm. All students are expected to attend with a caregiver. The conferences are 20 minutes long and involve a discussion about the learner as a whole, information will be shared from subject teachers and student reflection, as well as data on attendance, Managing Self and Relating to Others. There will be an opportunity to discuss student learning as a whole and set goals that the Whanau Teacher will help the student monitor as the year progresses. This is a change from traditional subject reporting aimed at lifting all students learning, don't miss out. If there is a need to meet with a particular teacher this can be discussed at the Whanau teacher conference.

Information on how to access student grades for 'Managing Self' and 'Relating to Others' on the Parent portal are below. 'Managing Self' and 'Relating to Others' are two of the Key Competencies from the New Zealand Curriculum that we are focusing on developing in depth. They have been identified as some of the 'soft skills' necessary for success in life. Information on how to book the conference interview is also attached.

How to log in to the parent portal:

- 2. Your login is the email address that Menzies College has on file. If you do not remember which it is then please contact Menzies College office to check. If you have not given Menzies College your email you will not be able to log in.
- 3. First time login you need to click on 'forgot password'. You will be emailed a temporary password.
- 4. Put your temporary password in. You will then be asked to change the password to something permanent.

 NOTE: Two caregivers cannot have the same email address. You either only use one email (linked to one caregiver) or you need two separate email addresses.

- 6. Select a time to meet (conference times are a maximum of 20 minutes in length)
- 7. If you do not have access to the internet please contact the school office and they will book you in for a time.

Technology Issues getting onto the Parent Portal

We are aware that there have been some issues getting on the parent portal. If this is the case for you please ring the school and check that you are using the same email address that the school has loaded for you. If you continue to have problems ignore logging on to the portal, (we will sort this at the conference), go straight to booking your conference time. If you are able to get onto the portal you may notice that attendance data is not accurate for some students. This is because we are now operating a new student management system that causes problems when students change classes or don't appear on rolls because their courses are online. We are working on correcting this error. Thank you for your patience.

Board of Trustees Report

The Board held its Annual General Meeting on Thursday 23 February (we transferred to the new music room to have a look. Wow!). Mrs Carole Bee was returned as chairperson and Mr Allister Gauldie was elected vice-chairperson un-opposed. Mrs Bianca Gibbs and Allister were elected to the position of financial officers to take responsibility for reporting on this to The Board. A number of other committees were formed to deal with discipline, property and appointments.

This meeting was followed by a general meeting at which Mr Carl Lambert spoke to The Board about the National Standards data that is collected by our contributing schools and the Year 7 and 8 teachers and the work the Lower Mataura Valley Community of Learning (CoL) are doing with the information this data shows. He spoke about the changes that have been made in the Year 7 and 8 teaching programme delivery in order to address some of the challenges that the data was highlighting. Carl also emphasised the enormously collaborative work being done now in ensuring that all our CoL schools are assessing at the same time and being consistent across all schools with their judgment.

Other matters dealt with included:

- We began our work on drafting a treaty of Waitangi policy. The intent of this document is to formalise our acknowledgement of The Treaty of Waitangi as the founding document of our nation and to give rigour to our support of our Māori students and their whanau to create a school environment and culture that supports Māori students to achieve as Māori, and allows non- Māori to engage with, and develop an understanding of tikanga Māori (Māori customs).
- The tabling of the draft School Charter for submission to the Ministry of Education. An excellent document that will drive the school forwards.
- The Music Suite is almost complete, with just a few finishing touches to be completed. It is a wonderful facility and with the new and bright environment I am sure the students will love their time in music.
- The board indicated its intention to sign a memorandum of understanding with a local dairy farm to allow students to carry out practical work and gain unit standards relating to Agriculture.
- We of course started the year with a number of Outdoor Education proposals and we are very thankful to the staff and parents/caregivers that continue to support these events to allow our students these experiences.
- We also received and regretfully accepted the resignation of Mr Ben Tapper from the science department as he makes the move further north with his family following his wife's career move. We thank him for his dedication and wish them well in their new community.

The Board would like to take this opportunity to welcome the families and whanau that have students at Menzies College for the first time and encourage you to introduce yourself to any of The Board members as the opportunity arises. We are after all, your representatives and we would love to meet you and hear your views on how we are doing.


HPV Immunisation

We would like parents/guardians to attend all appointments with their child as Dental Therapists provide parents with valuable advice to support their children's good oral health.
