From the Principal's Desk

Kia Ora

Last weekend I read with interest the report in the NZ Herald about New Zealand's latest performance in the Programme for International Assessment (PISA) and how poorly our nation's students are now performing. Our 15 year olds' maths scores have dropped by more than any other developed nation since PISA began in 2000. Our reading scores have dropped more than all except three countries and our science scores by more than eight of the 24 developed nations who are involved in this assessment. Admittedly, you can hold this sort of data at arm's length and explain away a variety of reasons why the decline has happened, but when I looked back I discovered we have slipped in the PISA ranking for nearly every year since 2012. We once used to nearly top these rankings and now we should be embarrassed with where we are now positioned.

Ironically, the two biggest changes in New Zealand schooling since PISA started have been the introduction on NCEA in 2002 and National Standards from 2010. Both introduced with good intent, but the question we are left with, is how much impact they have on deep learning when schools are compared in creative "league tables" and the government have the wrong drivers such as 85% of 18 year olds passing NCEA Level 2. Just as an extra …I also read that the average 15 year old in Singapore studies for an average of 22 hours a week doing homework and private tuition outside of school.

During the week we heard of the success of our two students, Brittany Tiller and Beth Scott who were part of the New Zealand Under18 women's ice hockey team that won gold at the 2017 Women's Challenge Cup of Asia in Bangkok. Beth, with 17 goals, was one of the leading scorers in the tournament. Well done girls, we look forward to hearing more about your tournament at our next full assembly.

Also, Levi Smith competed extremely well in Australia with his kick boxing and he will also be writing an article to explain his great success. His two silver and one bronze medal are most impressive.

All the best to our 14 athletes who compete tomorrow at Surrey Park in the Otago/Southland championships. Generally we have had good success at this meeting and I'm sure they will all do us proud again on Saturday.

A reminder that Monday 27 March is a Teacher Only Day.

Students with a passion for astronomy (SWAPA)

The Royal Astronomical Society of New Zealand (RASNZ) is interested in promoting astronomy to young students in New Zealand schools who have an interest and passion for this science.

The Society is holding its annual conference in 2017 at the Otago Museum in Dunedin from Friday 12 to Sunday 14 May 2017. The normal registration for non-members of the Society is \$195 to attend the conference, but the Society is waiving this cost for up to 10 young astronomers who are keen to go and find out more about their science. They are also offering to these young astronomers, participation in the conference banquet and planetarium show (normally \$80) on the evening of 13 May, making a total prize package of \$275 each.

Astronomers from throughout New Zealand and some from overseas will participate in this year's conference. Many of these will be amateur astronomers and RASNZ is pleased that amateurs in New Zealand contribute so much to the strength of the Society, together with a core of professionals, mainly in our Universities. To find out more about the RASNZ annual conference, the Society's website at www.rasnz.org.nz should be consulted.

To be considered for free registration at the RASNZ conference, students should email a short statement of no more than 300 words explaining why they would like to attend the conference and why they are interested in astronomy. This statement should be sent to RASNZ President, John Drummond (email: john_drummond@xtra.co.nz – that is john underscore drummond @ xtra.co.nz) by Friday 7 April at 5 pm. Please also include your name, school, city, age, year of study at school in 2017, email address, telephone contact and science teacher's name. The winners of the competition will be selected for a clear enthusiasm for astronomy, their seniority and good English in their submitted statement. Alternatively, a printed version can be posted to John Drummond, PO Box 113, Patutahi 4045. The RASNZ students with a 'Passion for Astronomy' competition is most suited for students who are in years 11, 12 or 13 in 2017.

Those who win the free registration will be notified around mid April 2017. Winners are expected to be able to go to Dunedin and take part in the conference. The free registration includes lunches and other refreshments on the 13 and 14 May and a reception on the evening of 12 May. The cost of travel to Dunedin and accommodation are not covered in this offer.

This is a great opportunity to expose students to the exciting world of astronomy and the various sciences that are linked to it.

2017 Great Kiwi Science, English And Mathematics Competitions







The annual CEM Great Kiwi Science, English and Mathematics competitions are skills-based and closely aligned with the New Zealand Curriculum. They are run for students in Year 7-10. The competitions cater for students of all abilities and measure the performance of students in each curriculum area. Each test is 45 minutes long, is completed on-line and consists of 40 short answer questions. The competitions will run during the last two weeks of Term Two and we envisage that results will be returned to us at the start of Term Three. The cost for each test is \$8.50 and students can enter one, two or three tests (at their discretion). To enter, students can collect a permission letter from the school office. Permission slips (and entry fees) should be returned to school no later than **Wednesday 13 April**.

Defence Careers Experience (DCE)

STAR Courses

In conjunction with the Government, secondary schools, polytechnics and other training providers are helping young people identify their vocational pathway by offering STAR courses which allow students to study programmes not available through their secondary school. This offers an opportunity for students to have a clear pathway into tertiary programmes or to achieve vocational credits alongside their school qualifications.

What is STAR?

A Secondary Tertiary Alignment Resource (STAR) course introduces secondary school students to training for a specific career or study at tertiary level. STAR courses are short and are only available through polytechnics and private training organisations. Students participate in short-term programmes or 'taster courses' for a few days at a time, or one day per week for several weeks.

Otago/Southland Athletics Championships


