From the Principal's Desk

Kia ora

Next Wednesday, 16th August from 3.30pm, we will be hosting our Open Night with about 60 families coming through the school to consider what Menzies College can offer in the way of quality education for the next seven years. It is at this time that we can reflect on who we are as a school and consider how well we are achieving our vision for a learner at Menzies College. A number of essential characteristics make up Menzies College:

- We accept all students irrespective of their academic, culture or behavioural background and do an outstanding job in trying to make school enjoyable, successful and consistently safe for them.
- Staff regularly inquire in to how and what they are teaching. We have a curriculum that allows us, as a small rural school, to meet the needs of students so they are prepared for their best vocational pathway on leaving school. Over the years we have established some important partners who assist our programmes.
- Our 2016 NCEA roll based results are excellent. Those students, who should have passed well, did so and many other students got across the line through hard work from both themselves and our staff.
- We have spent a significant amount of money on making computers easily accessible to all students in all classes and have seen the lift in learning engagement that has taken place.
- Students get to experience all the cultural, sporting or academic opportunities a school of our size could possibly provide and we have a reputation for doing remarkably well for 320 students. This demands a lot from a good number of students of all ages but in the end builds well-adjusted and skilled young citizens. Our relationship with our parents and caregivers has assisted greatly in our ability to deliver so much.
- With a modern technology block, including our recently upgraded music suite, computer rooms and the community pool and gym facilities, our buildings, resources and grounds are in very good condition. Students appreciate the environment in which they learn.

As Principal I often reflect upon the fantastic support provided to us by our parents/caregivers and the wider community and through the relationships formed with Whanau, we can collectively bring so much more to the development of our future citizens. At times, our size is a drawback but the benefits of everyone knowing who everyone is, far out-weigh the benefits of being a huge school. When we host an open night, have visitors or represent the school there is no reason not to be proud of Menzies.

NZQA Reminder

Payment of NCEA fees

These are due to the school office on or before **Friday 25 August.** The cost is \$76.70. You may apply for Financial Assistance if you have (or qualify for) a benefit, have a community services card, and/or have more than one child sitting NCEA this year. If you are unsure please contact either Judy Gould or Pete Wilkinson at school. There are forms available from the school office and online at www.nzqa.govt.nz/assets/qualifications-and-standards/qualifications/ncea/Application-For-Financial-Assistance.pdf
This decreases fees from \$76.70 to \$20 for one student or \$30 for two. If you do not pay by the due date there is a \$50 late fee. Although fees are collected by the school the money is forwarded to NZQA on the due date.

Student NZQA Login

If you do not know your username or password you can go online and do a re-set password (use your NSN number as your username – you can find your NSN number on the Edge parent or Student portal). You can also ring NZQA 0800 697296 and they can reset your login for you. Credits are updated on to the internet at the beginning of each month. Check online to see that you are correctly entered in your subjects and standards (both on NZQA and on Edge to see that they match up). Students have been shown this process many times. If there are any who need more help ask them to see their Whanau teachers or Mr Wilkinson.

NOW IS THE TIME TO CHECK THAT YOUR INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL ENTRIES ARE CORRECT.

Driver Licence Credits

Forms are available at the school office to get your licence added to your record of learning. You get 2 credits at Level 1 for holding a learners licence, 4 credits at Level 2 for restricted and 2 credits at Level 2 for full. It is a good idea to get this added to your record of learning even if you do not need the credits to pass NCEA Level 1 or 2. Once the form is completed take it to Mr Wilkinson to enter your credits.

EDGE Update

At our last assembly students were shown the EDGE APP. Parents and students can download the app for free, for Android or Apple. Search Musac Edge and select the purple app with the letter 'e'. The first time you log in to the app you use the email and password that you have for the student or parent portal. You then get to select a four digit pin that you can use for future log ins. At present the app shows student caregiver information and subject timetable. Soon there will be the ability to view student credits and attendance through the app. The future plan for the Edge App is to be able to do 80%+ of everything that you can do and see on the Edge portals.


