Our Year 11 to 13 students will break in three weeks on 8 November to start their NCEA exams. I wish all students well for this important period in their academic journey and given the positive feedback from the practice exams last term, I'm confident they will approach them with the right attitude. Staff have made themselves available for tutorials up until exams, giving students the opportunity to complete standards that are still ongoing.



Five of our Year 13 students have received outstanding financial scholarships to assist with their tuition and accommodation fees for next year. Hannah Fotheringham and Ally Gutsell both received a University of Otago 'Māori and Pacific Peoples' Entrance' Scholarship which is worth \$12,000 each. 
