From the Principal's Desk

Kia ora

NCEA exams started last week and most students have completed one or two exams already. We have been pleased with the attitude that our seniors have displayed towards these and their uptake of tutorial opportunities. This can be a stressful time and it is important that students and their whanau talk about how they are preparing themselves for exams whilst also managing themselves with good sleep, diet and some recreation over the three weeks.

We have a predicted intake of 56 new students into our school in February 2018, 48 of these will be placed in Year 7 with most of the others coming into Year 9. These are good numbers and we thank the community and contributing schools for supporting us as the roll continues to grow. Next Friday 24th, we will hold our New Entrant's Day with all those students meeting at the hall at 8.45am.

On Wednesday this week I was fortunate to attend the first day of the Cate Conference (Career Education) being hosted in Invercargill and listened to three wonderful speakers who were all connected with the South. I was most impressed with the opening address from Lucy Griffiths (nee Cruickshank) explaining how she overcame her teenage adversities to become a successful business woman. This was followed by Allan Herbison a Professor of Neuroendocrinology at Otago University specialising in infertility and lan Taylor from Animation Research Ltd (Dunedin) who make those wonderful graphics we see on Sky Sport. On leaving school none of these speakers would have said they were going into these fields of work but each had a passion and 'can do' attitude that our students need to understand if they want great things to happen. The message for our students is about building capacity from experiences, being persistent in their beliefs and be continually open to new learnings. These people all succeeded due to a strong embedment of the key competencies we want to focus on in raising young people.

With the Coalition Government cracking into their promises over the first 100 days of office, the future look of National Standards remains unsure. The latest official material comes under the heading of 'Replacing National Standards' which in itself is a worry but in the meantime, it's business as normal. Families do need to know where their child sits against curriculum levels but once this information becomes a public document then fabrications seem to occur, especially in competitive school environments. Let's hope change brings about a simplistic model that sits neatly with the curriculum levels and allows for a development of learning beyond the extensive focus on reading, writing and maths. I'm also interested in their promise to fund schools who remove donation requests and the future of NCEA Level 1.

On Monday, staff will be engaged in interviews for our 2018 Head Students. Eleven students have put themselves forward for these two positions and listening to their responses always makes for a most enjoyable day. I appreciate that so many want this role in the school and look forward to their honesty and passion.

This year prize givings will take place during the last week of school commencing with the Seniors (Year 11-13) on Thursday, 7 December at 7.30pm and the Juniors (Year 7-10) on Friday afternoon starting at 1pm. Both events will be a celebration of achievement showcasing the talents of our students and it is an expectation that **all students** attend their respective prize giving in full school uniform.

Menzies Players awarded 'Southland Representative Awards'

Co-Captains of our Menzies College Girls 1st XI team, Summer Smith and Rhylee McGregor have been named Most Valuable Players for their respective Southland Representative teams for the 2017 season. Summer was awarded the 17th Grade Most Valuable Player award after very strong performances at the South Island Tournament. Timetabling Options

At today's Year 9 meeting at Whanau time, students were given information about their option subjects for next year. This is a new concept for these students because in Years 7-9, students do not make their own choices about what option subjects they take. (Option classes are the subjects outside the core subjects of English, Mathematics, Social Sciences, Science and Physical Education).

Now that the current Year 9 students are about to start Year 10, it is time to think about what subjects they would like to take. At this age, these decisions should be heavily weighted towards subjects that students enjoy and/or are good at. Very little weight should be given to what options friends are choosing or who the teacher may be. It is important to be aware that a lack of experience in a subject at Year 10 can have an effect on entering that subject in Year 11 (e.g. it would be difficult to 'pick up' Art for Level One NCEA if you did not take any Art options in Year 10). Students were given a booklet with information on the option choices. In Year 10 the year is split into two semesters (half years) and students do two options per semester. This gives students access to four options over the year which gives a wide range of experiences to then use when making subject decisions in later years.

The booklet includes information about the options offered, plus an indication of whether the subject is also available as another option in the second semester. Students will choose their second semester option near the end of Term 2 next year. Option choice sheets for the first semester are due in to the office by **Friday 24 November**. Students need to ensure these are in by the due date to secure places in their preferred options. If students are unsure about their choices they should approach their Whanau teacher and/or a teacher who teaches the subject in question. Any other enquiries, please contact Brendon Wallace.


