## From the Principal's Desk

### Kia ora

Next Wednesday 15 August is our Open Night and the school will be open from 3.30pm until 7.00pm for prospective students and their families to visit our facilities and meet with staff. Despite the primary school teacher's industrial action on the 15th, secondary schools across the country remain open for instruction and the Open Night will go ahead as planned. I have had the pleasure this week of visiting our contributing schools with some of our Year 7 and 8 students and it has been a most enjoyable experience to not just meet the Year 6 students but also to hear the stories our students tell about why they enjoy our learning environment and the opportunities they are provided with.

Today, Mr Simon Pearce leaves to take up a short term position at Aparima College. Mr Pearce has relieved for us while Mr Brown recovered from his broken leg and has completed the role well beyond expectations. We thank Mr Pearce for his contribution to the whole school at a time when hard material teachers are an endangered species.

On Monday 20 August there is a community consultation evening to be held at our school from 7.00pm. Everyone is invited, whether you have children in a local school or not. We want the trades, nurses, farmers, retailers, students, families, unemployed, retired, the lot, to have a 90 minute conversation about how education will look in the future. It's just an organised discussion with no right or wrong answers but we need to gather ideas and opinions.

This past week four of our school sports teams have had brilliant wins in their competitions. The senior girls soccer team defeated Wakatipu on Tuesday 6-1 to take out the Southland Secondary Schools Division 1 competition for the first time and is the culmination of many years of player development. Our Year 7 and 8 boys won the Eastern Southland Basketball competition on Monday with a comfortable win over Longford and on Wednesday night the senior boys took out their competition with a 60-51 win over St Peters College. Both these games were great to watch. Basketball is on a real high at school with four competitive teams playing in the Gore based competition. Last Friday the Year 8 girls netball team won the Moffett Cup in Invercargill defeating Tokonui in the final. It's pleasing to see these results and we wish all the best to our sports teams still in competition play-offs this weekend.

## Skiing at Remarkables/Coronet Peak

We will be running school ski trips this season and they are open for all year levels. The cost of this trip is \$110 for skiing or snowboarding. This price includes lift ticket, equipment rental, 1.5 hr lesson and transport. The next ski trip will be on 19 August (Remarkables) and then 26 August (Coronet Peak) and 16 September (Coronet Peak). This last trip we will possibly make juniors only as it is in the middle of exam week. All these dates are Sundays. Places on these trips will be on a "first in, first served" basis. Permission forms and payment are required by the Friday of the week before each trip. Payment for the first trip needs to be in by Friday 27 July. There is a limit of 20 students (if we have high demand for a trip we will look at booking a bus, needs to be 40 people interested for this to happen). The van will leave Menzies College car park at 5.30 am on the day - you will need to be there by 5.20 am. Any pick-ups or drop offs in Gore (Mobil Station) or Maitaia (Police Station) will need to be organised prior to the day and marked on the permission form. We will be returning to school at approximately 7.00 pm. The school office will be open and a phone available for students to use.

Each student will require appropriate gear, the following items are ESSENTIAL: (we will check these before we depart in the morning)

- \* Waterproof jacket and ski pants (or waterproof over-trousers)
- \* Warm fleece or wool jersey

- \* Lunch or money to buy lunch

Students are welcome to bring their own skis/boards if they prefer. All information on the permission form, including height and weight is needed. This information is pre-loaded onto an electronic lift pass and is used to speed up the rental process. NZSKI have strict rules around changes to school bookings. If a student withdraws from the trip after the Monday before a trip, refunds will only be given if a medical certificate is supplied. This is because changes can impact on the number of instructors and equipment available for other groups. Transport cost (\$55) is non-refundable after payment date unless the withdrawing student's spot is filled or the trip is cancelled. 


