From the Principal's Desk

Kia ora

Last Friday we farewelled our senior students and we need to thank them for the way in which they left the school. NCEA External Exams

These begun today with Level 2 Physics this morning and Level 1 Geography this afternoon. Morning exams begin at 9:30am and afternoon exams at 2:00pm. Exams are a maximum of three hours. Students have been given their admission slips and must have these for entry in to the exam room. Replacement slips can be printed from www.nzqa.govt.nz - students have to login. Students need to be present at least 20 minutes before their exam. If they are running late they have until 30 minutes after the start time of the exam to enter. If this is the case please call us so that we know. Students must know exactly what exams they are sitting and when. If they miss an exam there is nothing that we can do about it. If a student is ill or injured please contact Mr Wilkinson immediately so he is aware of the situation.
