## From the Principal's Desk

#### Kia ora

Welcome back as we start the 2019 school year. I trust you have had a restful break over the holiday period, enjoyed the company of friends and family and are ready to start the school year with enthusiasm.

Currently we have 335 students enrolled and this is a continuation of our roll increase over the last few years. The increased numbers contribute towards additional staffing, subject options and the finances of the school. We appreciate the strong support we have from our community in having your children attend the local school. Current class sizes are in the table below.

This year we are attempting a new timetable for our seniors with most having four or five of their options jammed into Monday to Thursday with Fridays being a single subject day that includes Gateway, Trades, Level 3 English, Media Studies, Legal Studies, Agriculture and BCITO among others.

Thanks to the parents/caregivers who attended our conferencing last week as we finalised student's timetables with whanau teachers and to those who attended Monday's Powhiri. The next stage in this process is to follow up at our 'Meet the Teachers Day' on 12 March for all new entrants.

We have four new staff this year. Miss Emily Radka has a Year 7 homeroom, Miss Steph Parkinson is teaching Technology and Physics and Mr Chris Crighton will take Legal Studies with our seniors on a Friday. Mrs Coralie McFadzien has also joined the staff as a teacher's aide.

Next week our senior students will attend their respective camps. The Year 12's head into Hope Arm on Monday with the Outdoor Education staff and a supportive group of parents. This is probably the best camp students undertake while at Menzies for the sheer personal challenge that occurs both on the water and above the bush line in the midst of Fiordland. The Year 13s begin their Peer Support Programme on Monday at school and will then be based at Edenview Camp looking at career options, expectations for this year and leadership development.

NCEA results at this stage look to be very much as expected and are on par with previous years. Final comparable results are not completed as yet. Students who worked hard have been well rewarded and those receiving merit and excellence endorsements will be recognised at the G F Walker Awards at 8.55am on Friday 22 February along with our new House Leaders and Committee members.

### **HPV Vaccination**

All boys and girls in Year 8 are able to have the HPV (Human Papillomavirus) vaccine at school to protect them against future infection from nine types of HPV that lead to cervical, anal, genital, mouth and throat cancers, as well as genital warts. The HPV vaccine is the final immunisation given as part of New Zealand's free childhood immunisation programme.

All Year 8 students will be given a consent form to take home which includes detailed information about the immunisation. Please complete the consent form (either consenting or declining to the school based immunisation programme) and return the form to school before Friday February 15th.



### **Science Department**

#### Hands On Otago 2019

For me, this course was very beneficial and important as at the time I was struggling with career options. This course helped me to narrow down the abundance of choices and helped me realise that I did know what I liked and what I enjoyed.

This Hands-On course ran from the 13-18 January at the University of Otago. There were 379 students who attended from all over New Zealand in either Year 12 or 13. With over 35 projects to choose from you were able to experience a very broad variety of potential career options. I was chosen to attend the Pharmacology and Toxicology project. Pharmacology is the study of the science behind the effects of drugs while Toxicology is very similar - it specialises in the study of the harmful effects of drugs and other chemicals. During this week long project there were three main experiments that we participated in. These were all very interesting but my favourite was the first one where we tested whether caffeine made you smarter. We did pre-testing of reaction time, tremor, memory, blood pressure and heart rate (on Monday) to set a standard. Then a couple of days later we took a shot of V pocket rocket and re tested all of the above tests to see if taking caffeine really did make us smarter. We found out comparing our before and after results from the small sample that it did not make us smarter but it did improve our reaction times as was expected.

It was very exciting to be able to stay in Studholme, a hall of Residence at Otago. You experienced the freedoms of being on your own and deciding how you were going to make the most of this new opportunity. The food was fantastic, catering for a wide range of needs and satisfying all demands. The structure of the course allowed you to have a fun action packed day while still fitting in the free time to recharge yourself and prepare for the next day ahead.

This was a fantastic opportunity being able to experience what it is like at University studying something that you might be interested in for a future career. I would highly recommend this course for any Year 11 or 12 student who is wanting to experience a week of University life before finishing school and for anyone who is uncertain of their career direction. Apply this year, it will help a lot.

I would like to thank Mrs Dale for suggesting this opportunity to me. I had a great time meeting new friends and making connections to last a lifetime. Thank you also to the MLT, the Wyndham Pioneer Lions Club and the Wyndham Lions Club for generously providing me with funding to attend this course. I am extremely grateful.

From profiling sand dunes to genetically modifying bacteria, the Otago University Advanced Students Science Academy allowed me to experience science on an entirely new level. With each day beginning at 8.00am and extending to 8.30pm the week-long camp was full of new experiences, knowledge and challenges. During this time I participated in two projects, Geography and Biochemistry/Genetics. Geography saw me traversing across sand dunes and beaches while Biochemistry and Genetics was far more lab-based. After being able to solve an albeit staged, murder using DNA testing techniques and discovering a new passion in Geography, the week renewed my excitement and passion for Science. Additionally, staying at Arana, a University Hall of Residence right in the middle of the campus, allowed for an immersive experience of university life. Likely, this will better equip me for the decisions and transitions involved in attending university next year. Altogether, the immersion in Science while surrounded by likeminded and passionate peers made for a truly rewarding experience.


### Year 13 Camp - 12-14 February

Welcome to the new school year! I am looking forward to meeting all the new pupils. We have a couple of great new books already.


