English Department

Regardless of the curriculum area reading is such a huge component of our teaching and learning programmes here at Menzies College. In our Year 9 and 10 English classes we have begun to 'wonder' about the manner in which we run our across school testing. As such, we decided this year to run a more traditional test (PAT Reading Comprehension) alongside the E-Asttle electronic testing. We are wondering how the results compare and what this tells us about the manner in which our students best read and understand text. Our Year 9 and 10 students have completed this test and been given the results. These are in the form of Stanines which we convert into curriculum levels. The results of these tests can be found on Learning Logs.

There are many ways that you can support reading at home, regardless of the 'age and stage' of your child/children. As teachers, we often encourage our students to read widely. This means to pick up texts which they are not usually drawn to. This helps students to understand the format and structure of a variety of texts and enables them to learn new vocabulary and derive new meaning. At home, you could encourage your son/daughter to read a film review of a movie you might be interested in. Alternatively reading the manual for some new gadget / technology could prove useful and again help to widen knowledge of language. Reading should be an enjoyable past-time, but for a lot of our students it can be a real challenge. Therefore, asking them to read a little each day is really helpful to their learning across ALL curriculum areas and improves their functional literacy.

Level Focus: Year Nine

Our Year Nine classes have been or are currently busy researching, writing and presenting in-class speeches. Our timing guideline for this is three minutes. We are always impressed by the courage our students show when delivering their speeches to their peers. Public speaking is an incredibly daunting activity! On top of this, 9FE and 9SR have been continuing their literature studies.



9FE are currently studying 'The Greatest Showman' which was released in 2017. It is a musical about the life of P.T. Barnum who is commonly called the 'father of the modern day circus'. This film is both fun to watch and discuss. There are many themes in it which link to our Semester One study of Facing Challenges. The photo on the right shows Tony Gourlie and Ollie Gutsell learning about film shots in class! (Please note this activity occurred on Mufti Day!)





9SR are also studying the NZ film 'Hunt for the Wilderpeople'. This is a comedy but the film also has elements of drama and so slots very nicely into the 9SR programme and overarching theme of overcoming obstacles.

Housekeeping

Entries are open for the ICAS English Competition. This competition runs annually and allows students to compete with others all around Australasia. The focus is on reading and will give students a placing within all students who participate. Permission forms are available from the office. The fee is \$15 and needs to be taken to the office, along with the permission form, by Friday 9 August. The competition will be sat during week nine of Term Three. This competition is a really great way for our students to see how they fare against students from New Zealand and Australia. It might be a particularly useful exercise for our senior students who will soon be sitting external examinations.

SMAC Maths (Southland Mathematics Association Competition) will be held in the last week of Term 3 and we have entered two teams at each year level from Years 7 to 10. This is a great competition where students solve problems using logic and mathematical strategies. When teams are confirmed we will be asking for parent help in transporting students to and from James Hargest College.




Library News




