Students who go on to tertiary education often comment on how grateful they are to Menzies College for the training given to them in speech preparation and presentation for oral presentations in their tertiary courses.

Focus: Year Ten

Classes 10FE and 10PW are working on film studies while 10KL are designing static images based on their class film study. Early next term all three Year Ten classes will work together towards gaining three NCEA Level One credits for Achievement Standard 91480: 'Respond Critically to Significant Aspects of Visual Text Through Close Reading Supported By Evidence'. All three teachers will work with the classes as a large group to closely scaffold the preparatory work needed to attempt the summative assessment. The classes have already completed some of the revision work needed for this exercise in their film studies. The successful students will be able to bank the three credits achieved towards NCEA Level One. Mrs Knapp will send out detailed information before students begin the unit.

NZQA Information

External exams are almost here. Exams run from Friday 8 to Thursday 28 November and are held in the school hall. Students are advised to check their exam entries on Edge and NZQA Learner Login to make sure everything is correct. Personalised exam admission slips will be given to students early in Term 4. These are required so students can check everything is correct AND to make sure that the student knows what day and time their exam is. If there are any issues with incorrect internal or external NCEA standards we need to know as soon as possible.



Te Kura Summer SchoolAs the third term draws to an end planning for Te Kura Summer School has begun in earnest. This is the fifth year we have offered summer study which has grown in popularity every year. THE CORRESPONDENCE SCHOOL. More than 1500 students took advantage of Summer School last year to top up their NCEA

credits, enabling them to go on to either further study, training or employment. We work in partnership with schools to ensure we are meeting NZQA regulations. Because students have a single Record of Achievement in an academic year, credits achieved by a student (by the NZQA deadline - usually mid-February) are reported by the student's previous school of enrolment.

Our research has shown that most students who come to us, learn about what we offer for Summer School from their own schools. Schools have told us that in many cases they have elicited a good response from students by putting up Summer School information on their own websites. English, Maori and Samoan courses are delivered online so with access to a computer and the internet, students can learn anywhere and anytime. We offer a range of internal standards at NCEA Levels 1, 2 and 3 and our qualified teachers are available online to support students. 


LMV Pet Day Sponsored by Vetco Supported by ANZ, Farm Source, Wyndham Four Square, Wyndham Freight Services
